CHAPTER 3

Our Initial Impressions of the Supernatural Dimensions

Dany, one or two friends, and I made several incursions into the Chay dimensions through the Hebrew words of Genesis 2:7. During this process, I had many questions and intriguing impressions of each dimension. In this chapter, I'll share my initial impressions of these fascinating dimensions. I will also share the questions and insights I had at the start of our Chay experience because I think you might be interested in this aspect. I am sure you will have questions as you explore Chay and know that this is normal and actually beneficial. I hope my curiosity resonates with you as I share my initial thoughts on each dimension.

Let's begin with Genesis 2:7:

"And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul."

To restore and get the best experience from each portal, Dany got an order to follow:

"And the Lord God (1) **formed** (2) * man of the (3) **dust** of the (4) **ground**, and (5) **breathed** into his (7) **nostrils** the (6) **breath** of (11) **life**; and (8) **man** (9) **became** a living (10) **soul**."

Note that door number 2 not found in the text above, which is the Hebrew word Eth, doesn't exist in the English Bible. I am not sure if it is translated into any other language, but it is not shown on the English text except when read in Hebrew.

The access doors are pronounced in Hebrew, so the transliterated words will help you say them. I use the terms doors, portals, rooms, or dimensions interchangeably to refer to the same concept.

Oh, and if I didn't mention it clearly before, "Chay" means life, and that's the name we've chosen for the entire framework. We refer to the structure containing the doors to all 10 dimensions as the "Chay house."

To start, we'll look at each key word in Genesis 2:7, which act as entry points to the dimensions associated with their names.

#Yatsar: to form

Early Insights: Door number one, #Yatsar, leads us into the first dimension, meaning "to form."

Entering #Yatsar feels like stepping into a dark, moist space, reminiscent of a cave—a womb-like environment. Initially, our approach wasn't to explore these surroundings in detail. We simply checked if this dimension was ready for deeper exploration in the next dimension.

Conception and birth therapies are challenging; many individuals haven't embarked on this journey. #Yatsar serves as an ideal starting point for exploring birth-related themes. It is a great template to begin your assessment of this stage of your life, however you might need specialized help for more in-depth healing if

you have trouble clearing out everything you are shown here.

#Eth

Early Insights: #Eth, a word found in Hebrew between the words *formed* and *man* in Genesis 2:7, remains untranslated in English, yet it holds an intriguing significance. Equivalent to Alpha and Omega in Greek, as it is made up of the first and last letter of the Hebrew alphabet, it sparked my curiosity—what does it signify? Is there a connection to Jesus, akin to Alpha and Omega?

We initially found a structure we thought was a house, but Dany's vision revealed it to be a warehouse, where each shelf holds items representing our future paths—some needing removal as they no longer serve our growth,

while others symbolize opportunities for development and fulfillment. We didn't know yet it was related to hope, and while trying to take things out or put things in, we discovered our dog in there, but it wasn't its place. Why? Because this place was where we needed to keep those things that were going to build our legacy.

Just a few words on Rodrigo's #Eth

Dany once said, "A good book to write is one that you would enjoy reading yourself." This inspired me to share my personal experience with Chay, specifically in the Dimension of Eth. In my Eth, inside the warehouse, I found our dog, called Pupy. Since we don't have children, Pupy played a crucial role in our lives. We took great joy in teaching her, and she learned over 18 words, continually expanding her vocabulary. Pupy also provided comfort to Dany during her struggles with Multiple

Chemical Sensitivity and severe Rheumatoid Arthritis, calming her in times of pain. Although our social life was somewhat limited, Pupy was my companion during our weekend jogs. We even won first and second place in dog-owner races. She was an integral part of our lives, providing emotional support and companionship in many ways.

When Dany guided me to my Eth, Pupy appeared there, which felt wrong—ouch, that was painful. Perhaps “wrong” isn’t the best word; it wasn’t her rightful place. Why? Eth is meant for our hopes for the future, our profession, or our legacy—essentially, things that represent our future aspirations. This situation made us reflect on how easily we can project elements of our past into our hopes. For instance, placing our parents in Eth would

miss the point, as we are in their Eth, not the other way around.

This story illustrates how you never know what insights you might gain, in my case my hopes in the #Eth dimension. The Chay framework proves to be a powerful tool for self-discovery and understanding.



Puppy could have been a reason why not to move to France, but we moved, and we are so thankful that we did. We received the Chay revelation a few months after arriving in Bordeaux and it has been the best decision since then.

#Aphar: dust

Aphar, meaning dust in Hebrew, is the third word that gives access to a portal. Dust (aphar) is the word found in the scripture that says man was made out of the dust of the ground. Stepping into this place, there was a stairway, and I immediately related the shape of the spiral stairway to our human DNA. This connection became more tangible when Dany discovered a sandy, clay-like substance mixed with shinny particles of red gold. I was intrigued by the idea that this place could potentially serve as a means to cleanse or refine our DNA. As I contemplate further, I wonder: Could the soft sand, also described as wet clay, connect to the purity or contamination of our genetic makeup? I also found intriguing the idea of going down a spiral ladder to an ocean-like beach. Later visions have given us the

understanding of the connection between our DNA and the ocean below.

#Adamah: ground

In our first encounters with Adamah, we discovered a hidden sanctuary within this realm—a personal refuge where each person could find safety and love, akin to a private and intimate space. The word "Adamah" means ground, and I couldn't help but connect this to the heart, recalling the parable of the Good Sower where the ground represents the human heart. The access to this place could be hindered, making its state of conservation a significant observation. It showed the state of a part of our heart, resonating with themes of safety and love. While some may perceive it as a protected building, a chamber, or a space inside a mountain, we found the name of our secret place to be called the Room of Love. It

held a crucial role in our relationship with God as a father and our personal relationships and. The Room of Love demanded a thorough examination of every aspect to understand what might be going wrong in this room.

#Naphach: to blow

In #naphach, meaning 'to blow', we usually encountered it as a dim, obscure space where intense exploration was necessary. It was apparent that this place required emptiness or a sense of peace before further progress. Early observations hinted at ancestral influences—not tangible things but more like hindering frequencies and lingering fears that needed clearing. As this dimension was explored, having space to grow and expand seemed to be the key point here, along with experiencing the greatness of the universe and inspiring awe in us.

What if the key to our spiritual and personal growth lies in embracing the awe-inspiring vastness of the Universe and the divine?

#Neshamah: breath

In #Neshamah - Hebrew for breath - this portal, as we experienced it, is a place to receive breath, specifically the breath of blessing from one's father. This blessing is compared to exhaling, which follows the act of inhaling in the previous dimension, #naphach. In #naphach, space is created for breath, setting the stage for the exhale of blessing in the current context.

While both #Naphach and #Neshamah are related to breath, #Neshamah aims to have a space filled with a blessing. The way to determine if a participant is in #Neshamah is

by checking if something feels empty, indicating the need to be filled. Breath in this dimension could manifest as a fragrance, wind, direction, or movement, clearly illustrating a father's blessing imparted in one's life.

Could the importance of a father's blessing in one's life be as vital as breath itself? It appeared to be an essential factor in fulfilling one's purpose. What if it is, in fact, the key to instilling determination and providing direction in a person's life?

Aph: nostrils

In the region of Aph, accessed through the word that means nostrils, we sought after the Pinwheel, discovering alongside it other intriguing elements such as the River of Your

Life and a serene resting place known as the Field of Peace.

Just as a reminder, when Dany first entered her #Aph region, she saw and restored a four-colored windmill, resembling a pinwheel with leaf-like blades. Restoring that pinwheel is instrumental in changing the atmosphere of this dimension through the Breath of God.

From both Dany's experience and mine, we learned early on that the pinwheel, ideally perched atop a cliff overlooking the river below, could be lost or in need of retrieval. In some cases it might be stolen, broken, stuck, or concealed. Once returned to its rightful place, we invoke God to breathe the Breath of Life into it, causing the Pinwheel to move and transform the atmosphere of this Edenic place.

What particularly fascinated me here was: How could the Pinwheel, a seemingly simple object, exist in this sacred space akin to the human heart and provide the energy of life needed for this space to thrive? Its shape captivated me, resonating with spiraling symbols found in ancient cultures. I also pondered: How does the energy generated by the pinwheel connect to concepts like life force, known in some cultures as Prana or Chi? I wondered if the Breath of Life described in Genesis 2.7 had anything to do with these terms I heard before.

Note: Daniela's first vision of the Pinwheel showed blades with leaf-like tips, each in a different color: red, green, yellow, and blue.



#Adam: mankind or man

In exploring #Adam, the 8th door, I sensed it represents something new—a transition or transformation. This room, named after Adam, seems to reflect the image of humanity as originally created in God's likeness. But what deeper meanings might this 'new Adam' hold?

What meanings might the concept of a 'new Adam,' symbolizing a new man, hold within the context of this dimension? God made Adam in

His own image; could this be related to the purpose or function of this space?

#Hayah: to become

#Hayah is the Hebrew word for "to be," as in "...and Adam became a living soul." It's a verb, and from the first time this dimension opened for Dany, it was clear that it was tied to actions and transformation. This dimension wasn't just about existence; it was about becoming—shifting from one state to another.

How does this state of change—this becoming—integrate into our overall spiritual journey through the different rooms of the Chay mansion?

#Nephesh: being

When I first opened Strong's Dictionary to look up the Hebrew word Nephesh, I felt confused. Nephesh is translated into so many different things—soul, living being, life, self, person, desire, passion, appetite, and emotion. The dictionary mainly defines it by how it's used in various scriptures, making it hard to understand the core meaning of the #Nephesh dimension. The many translations didn't seem connected. I realized that finding the common thread across all dimensions was crucial to truly grasping this one. However, one thing became clear early on: Nephesh is linked to walking in our life's purpose.

#Chay: life

At first, the Hebrew word Chay seemed like just another one of the ten words from Genesis 2:7 that interacted with our spirit. Though we knew it represented a dimension, we later discovered that Chay actually connected all the other rooms. Keep reading, as I'll share a map and more details about this in the next chapter.

It wasn't long before Dany saw the full picture and recognized Chay as the corridor with all ten doors, providing access to the other dimensions.

It's truly a mystery that in Genesis 2:7, when it says God blew the breath of life, the original text doesn't say 'life' but 'lives.' Yes, as in many lives—it says 'breath of lives.' Isn't that intriguing?

Oh my, there's so much more to learn as I write this introduction.

Follow me into the next chapter, where I will explore the various insights and experiences, we gathered while examining how others interacted with the different Chay dimensions. We'll see into how these dimensions fit into a new framework for healing, as we initially saw it, although we now understand it to be much more than a healing framework.
